Advice Letter No. 555

Dear Madame/Sir:

San Jose Water Company (U-168-W) (SJWC) hereby transmits for filing the following changes in tariff schedules applicable to its service area and which are attached hereto:

These tariffs are submitted pursuant to General Order No. 96-B, Water Industry Rules 4.3, 7.3.2.(2), and 8.3. This advice letter is designated a Tier II Advice Letter in compliance with Order 96-B, Water Industry Rule 7.3.2.(2). SJWC requests that the relief requested become effective November 26, 2020 (30 days from filing).

By this filing SJWC submits an interruptible special contract (Attachment A) for Commission approval. This contract satisfies the five standards established in Commission Resolution W-3937, dated September 7, 1995 (W-3937). Consequently, this advice letter proposes to add this contract to SJWC’s *“List of Contracts and Deviations”* tariff sheet.

The Domestic Water Contract for Interruptible Service (Contract) being submitted with this filing (Attachment A) requests interruptible domestic water service to one parcel on Old Santa Cruz Highway within the unincorporated area of the County of Santa Clara. This parcel is owned by Erika Lauren Kula and currently served from a well that is failing. A service connection has been requested for the parcel. Attachment A - Exhibit A shows the location of this property (APN 558-08-074) where the new service connection would be installed on Old Santa Cruz Highway within SJWC’s Mountain District service area.

The owner of this parcel is willing to accept an interruptible service as as evidenced by the contract. Local mutual water companies are not able to serve this property as provided in Attachment B. Because of this situation, SJWC is willing in this case to provide service on a limited basis for the well-being of the parcel owner. To minimize impacts to existing Mountain District customers, the service will include a flow limiter to limit peak flow at the service to 10 gallons per minute.

Pursuant to the contract the owner will be charged for water service pursuant to SJWC's Schedule No. 1, "*General Metered Service*" or its successor tariff that may be in place from time to time. The services pursuant to this contract will also be subject to any other rate restrictions that may be imposed by tariff as a result of drought conditions (such as Schedule 14.1) or any other special unforeseen condition. Note that this will not be a service area extension, but rather provision of an interruptible service to a independent customer outside of SJWC's service area.

Resolution W-3937 established the following five criteria for submitting special contracts for interruptible service approval through an Advice Letter:

- (1) *The customer cannot be served at G.O 103 standards at a reasonable cost,*
- (2) *The customer is willing to take service at less than G.O. 103 standards,*
- (3) *The limitations will be recorded as a deed restriction,*
- (4) *The residence to be served is in an area in which additional growth is unlikely, and*
- (5) *The final installation, including customer-provided facilities, meets all local permit requirements.*

The domestic water service proposed in this contract satisfies the five criteria as shown below:

- (1) These parcels can be served at G.O. 103 standards for pressure and location. However, in order to minimize impacts to existing Mountain District customers, the service will include a flow limiter to limit peak flow at the service to 10 gallons per minute.
- (2) As provided in the Contract, the owner is willing to take service at less than GO 103A standards.
- (3) A copy of the deed restriction to be filed is included as Attachment A to the Contract.
- (4) The parcels to be served is in an area where additional growth is unlikely due to the wooded terrain and lot size building limitations by the County of Santa Clara.
- (5) Permitting related to the installation of this service will be at the owner's request through the County of Santa Clara.

As required by GO 96B, Water Industry Rule 8.3, the Contract contains the provision that:

"This Contract may not become effective until it is approved by the California Public Utilities Commission ("CPUC"). This Contract at all times shall be subject to the jurisdiction of the CPUC, and hence, to any modifications as the CPUC may direct from time to time in the exercise of its jurisdiction."

Effective Date

SJWC requests an effective date 30 days from filing.

Protests and Responses

Anyone may respond to or protest this advice letter. A response does not oppose the filing but presents information that may prove useful to the Commission in evaluating the advice letter. A protest objects to the advice letter in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds may include the following:

- 1) The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the advice letter;
- 2) The relief requested in the advice letter would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies;
- 3) The analysis, calculations, or data in the advice letter contain material error or omissions;
- 4) The relief requested in the advice letter is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding;
- 5) The relief requested in the advice letter requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the advice letter process; or
- 6) The relief requested in the advice letter is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory (provided that such a protest may not be made where it would require relitigating a prior order of the Commission).

A response or protest must be made by electronic mail and must be received by the Water Division within 20 days of the date this advice letter is filed. The address for mailing or delivering a protest is:

The advice letter process does not provide for any responses, protests or comments, except for the utility's reply, after the 20-day comment period.

SJWC has no advice letters pending before the Commission.

In compliance with Paragraph 4.3 of General Order 96-B, a copy of this advice letter has been sent via electronic mail to all interested and affected parties as detailed in Attachment C. No copies are being mailed due to the current shelter in place order.

This filing will not cause the withdrawal of service, nor conflict with other schedules or rules.
