These tariffs are submitted pursuant to General Order No. 96-B, Article 12 in accordance with the Rules of Practice and Procedure established by the California Public Utilities Commission in Decision No. (D.) 22-06-013, dated June 2, 2022.

Through this filing, San Jose Water Company (SJWC) requests authorization to increase its authorized rate base by \$43,314,414 and its revenue requirement by \$6,817,959 or 1.16% through rate base offset for plant additions associated with the Advanced Metering Infrastructure (AMI) Project.

Background

On December 6, 2019, SJWC filed Application 19-12-002 (AMI Application) to request approval of cost recovery for its Advance Metering Infrastructure (AMI) project. On August 5, 2021, SJWC, Water Rate Advocates for Transparency Equity Sustainability (WRATES), and the Public Advocates Office (Cal Advocates) reached an all-party settlement on the AMI Application. The Commission issued D.22-06-013 on June 10, 2022, approving the all-party settlement in the AMI Application.

Per D.22-06-013 Ordering Paragraph 5:

“Beginning 30 days after the annual anniversary date of this decision beginning in 2023 and after each anniversary date through 2026, San Jose Water Company (SJWC) shall file a Tier 2 Advice Letter

annually to include the recorded costs of deployment of the Advance Metering Infrastructure into rate base after it is made use and useful. Interest during construction will be accrued on a monthly basis at SJWC's actual cost of debt."

Following the schedule outlined in the ordering paragraph would result in a rate change in early August. However, SJWC's rates change annually on July 1 to recover the wholesale water cost increase from Valley Water. To streamline implementation and minimize customer confusion, SJWC proposed to have a single rate change for the two filings of Valley Water and AMI, which would be effective on July 1. Frequent rate changes are confusing to customers and difficult to manage within SJWC's billing system, both Water Division and Cal Advocates were agreeable to this proposal.

SJWC filed Advice Letter 610 on May 23, 2024, to cover rate base offsets of \$4,878,538 for the period of June 10, 2022, through April 30, 2024. Annual filings thereafter will cover the 12-month period of May 1 through April 30.

This current filing covers AMI plant placed in service from May 1, 2024, through April 30, 2025. During this 12-month period, SJWC has put in service \$43,122,331 of plant and \$961,343 of capitalized interest, which results in total plant addition of \$44,083,674.

These are the AMI project components and In-Service Additions from May 1, 2024, through April 30, 2025:

1. AMI Data Collector Network - \$2,034,058
AMI Data Collector Network includes base stations (antennas) and networking equipment (router, firewalls, VPN tunnels) that collect data remotely from meter endpoints and transmit it to the AMI Headend System.
2. AMI Meters Endpoint - \$40,586,647
Smart meters with endpoints transmit hourly reads to the network. The older meters will be replaced, while the newer meters will be retrofitted with a new register. For the previous 12-month period, 51,321 meters upgraded to AMI Meter Endpoints, and have been notified of possible leak alerts.
3. AMI Headend System - \$118,214
The AMI Headend System receives and manages meter data and alerts (e.g., tampering, reverse flow, leaks) remotely through the AMI Data Collector network. It identifies and deployed meters and collects data at set intervals.
4. AMI Meter Data Management - \$383,412
AMI Meter Data Management System (MDMS), a vital part of smart grid infrastructure that collects, stores, processes, and analyzes meter data from smart meters. This system supports various utility applications, including more efficient billing and improved customer notification as part of the smart grid infrastructure.

Revenue Requirement

The capital addition is adjusted for depreciation and other standard expenses¹ for rate base offset filings resulting in a rate base increase of \$43,314,414², which corresponds to a revenue increase of \$6,817,959 or 1.16% as detailed in the workpapers.

¹ Property tax, uncollectible, and franchise tax.

²Capital additions were adjusted for weighted depreciation to arrive at total addition to rate base.

Effective Date

SJWC requests that the updated tariff sheets be effective July 1, 2025, to coincide with the rate change requested in Advice Letter 616 for the Valley Water wholesale water increases effective the same date to minimize customer confusion. The rates proposed in this filing is additive to those proposed in Advice Letter 616.

Protests and Responses

Anyone may respond to or protest this advice letter. A response does not oppose the filing but presents information that may prove useful to the Commission in evaluating the advice letter. A protest objects to the advice letter in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds may include the following:

- (1) The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the advice letter;
- (2) The relief requested in the advice letter would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies;
- (3) The analysis, calculations, or data in the advice letter contain material error or omissions;
- (4) The relief requested in the advice letter is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding;
- (5) The relief requested in the advice letter requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the advice letter process; or
- (6) The relief requested in the advice letter is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory (provided that such a protest may not be made where it would require relitigating a prior order of the Commission).

A response or protest must be made in writing or by electronic mail and must be received by the Water Division within 20 days of the date this advice letter is filed. The address for mailing or delivering a protest is:

If a distribution main of adequate size to serve a private fire protection system, in addition to all other normal service, does not exist in the street or alley adjacent to the premises to be served, then a service main from the nearest existing main of adequate capacity shall then be installed by the utility and the cost paid by applicant. Such payment shall not be subject to refund.
3. Service hereunder is for private fire protection systems to which no connections for other than fire protection purposes are allowed and which are regularly inspected by the underwriters having jurisdiction, are installed according to specifications of the utility, and are maintained to the satisfaction of the utility. The utility may install the standard detector type meter approved by the Board of Fire Underwriters for protection against theft, leakage or waste of water and the cost paid by the applicant. Such payment shall not be subject to refund.
